Faith

This past Thursday, Bishop Ricken announced Phase 2 of Returning to Mass, which will allow us to be able to start having Mass on weekends with certain stipulations. If the Diocesan committee for the Return to Mass, along with the pastor/pastoral leaders agree that the city and county health numbers of Covid-19 are at a certain safe level, we can begin to return to Mass starting the weekend of June 13-14 with the following conditions:

- 25% capacity (which is about 200 for our church) - we will have a weekly signup
- Temperature checks be taken at the door
- Face masks encouraged
- Safe social distance practices in place
- No Precious Blood at communion
- No congregating before and after Mass

We are planning as though we will start on June 13-14; however, that could change at any moment if there is a spike in Covid-19 numbers locally. I will be recording the 4pm Mass weekly and going on Facebook Live and our Website. While we are doing our best to return to Mass as close to normal, there will be some changes. To ease into Mass and for safety reasons, we will have the staff and clergy be servers, lectors, greeters for the month of June. Starting in the first weekend of July, the 4th and 5th, we will schedule certain liturgical ministries.

As I said before, Mass won't quite look the same as it used to for the time being. All these measures are put in place for your safety, as well as ours. That being said, these procedures have created a need for two new ministries:

- **HEALTH & SAFETY:** We need people to take temperatures of everyone walking into the church, as well as offer a mask if they do not have one. The diocese has asked to have one entrance into church, so we will be asking everyone to enter in the Mishicot Road entrance and come through those doors. We will have two doors be entrances and one door be the exit. These are no-contact thermometers, and take a second to record the temperature. Masks, gloves, and hand sanitizer will be provided.
- **CLEANING CREW:** Following each Mass, we need people to clean the church after Mass - wiping down every surface that could be touched, every pew, door handle, table. All items in the pews (bibles, prayer cards, pencils, envelopes) have been removed already. We have tons of disinfectant cleaner and one-use rags available. This is a large task, especially between the 8am and 10am Masses, but if we have a good number of volunteers, I believe we can get it done quickly.

If you are comfortable and willing to be an USHER, HEALTH & SAFETY member, or part of the CLEANING CREW, please get Sheila your blackout dates for the months of June, July, and August. You can email her at sheilab@spfcp.org or call her at the parish office, 920-793-4531. Let me remind everyone that the dispensation from Mass and Holy Communion remains in place during this pandemic, and anyone who does not feel safe or has underlying health issues that make you more vulnerable to covid-19 are encouraged to stay home.

Maybe the council develops a cleaning team that can handle that task following a mass, thoughts?

Father Dave Pleier, Priest Celebrant of Saint Peter the Fisherman (SPF) Catholic Parish, called me today with his blessing and gratitude in response to our order-wide exemplification of catholic life and outreach to the domestic church during this COVID-19 Pandemic.

Deacon Paul Gleichner, SPF Pastoral Leader and our Worthy Council Spiritual Advisor, also expressed his gratitude in speaking with WDGK Ray Seegers last Saturday. emailing me today that SPF Parish could use help with the sanitization process after each weekend mass. Ultimately, he'd like to have 'teams' who wipe everything down after each mass is complete. We could

form our own "Mother of Good Hope Cleaning Team," if we can organize this parish Return to Mass support by the weekend of June 13-14th. If you are comfortable with this and willing to be a part it, please let me or WFD Marv Krall know soonest.

Also continue to pray your rosary each day. We as Knights have been given this to pray each day and in the stillness of our hearts took the vow to do so during our exemplification. Now more than ever our prayer can provide comfort to ourselves and help to others.

If anyone would like to volunteer to lead the next Fifth Sunday Rosary in the SPF Church at 9:30 a.m. on SUN, August 30th; let, please let me or WDGK Ray know.
