At our recent meeting members of our council discussed that the Crossing is looking for a new 4D ultrasound machine. The Knights of Columbus had donated their original ultrasound unit through the Supreme initiative for Ultrasounds in Crisis pregnancy centers. The council noted that the funds raised from the Cornhole Tournament in February will go toward this program. Additionally, other councils in the district will be asked to support this and we will work with State Right to Life Director Dan Miller to help recruit donations from councils throughout the state. With the program if the state or local council raises 50% of the cost of the machine, the Supreme council will donate the balance to help purchase the machine. More to come on this exciting program.

Overall, the total amount that needs to be raised is around \$18,000. With the assistance of other councils in the state and the region we will meet this goal! Funds raised more than this amount will be donated to the Crossing to use for training and support of the services of the facility.
