The council reviewed the proceeds of our Tootsie Roll drive, and we were able to distribute checks of around \$1000.00 to the Miracle League of the Lakeshore and Ascend Services.

Additionally, the council presented checks in the amount of \$500.00 to TREP for our Food for Families Donation. We will complete the needed paperwork for a \$100.00 rebate from the Supreme Council and will send this to them as well once received.

The council donated \$150.00 to the American Wheelchair mission for the purchase of wheelchairs for those in need.

The council is hosting a Pancake Breakfast on Sunday, December 3rd at the parish hall. It will be from 8-12:00.

Life

We presented a check in the amount of \$1500.00 to the Crossing. Proceeds from the Lifesavers for Life drive and remaining funds from the Cornhole tournament made up the money for this donation. Belinda, the director of the Crossing notes that the Ultrasound machine that the council assisted in obtaining for them has been a significant benefit to the facility. She noted that with the changes in OB services with both Holy Family Memorial and Aurora Healthcare they are seeing more clients than in the past. She did note that they are in need of volunteers to help around the clinic. Additionally, she noted that gas cards are appreciated as donations as to help with getting clients to medical appointments out of the area for specialty care.
